

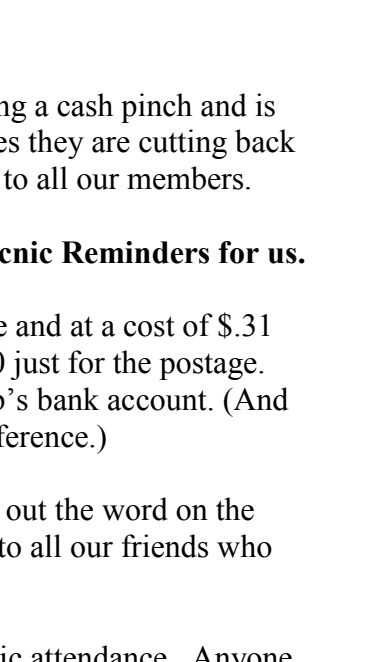
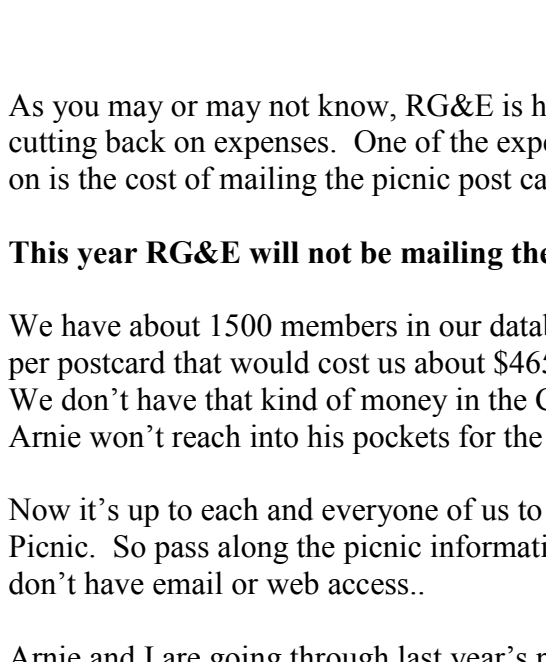

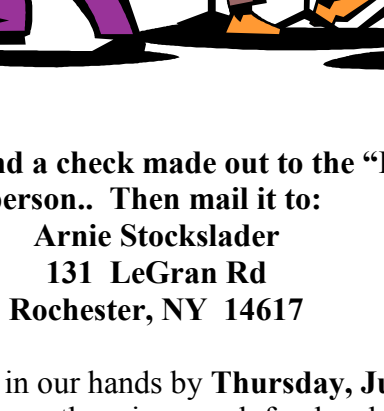
Now it's up to each and everyone of us to get out the word on the Picnic. So pass along the picnic information to all our friends who don't have email or web access..

We will then send the Picnic postcards to members who we do not have an email address for. The only catch is that we will only send the postcards to people who live in the area.

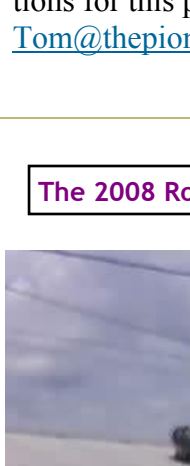
So again I must ask each and everyone of you to reach out to those individuals who live out of state and might want to attend.

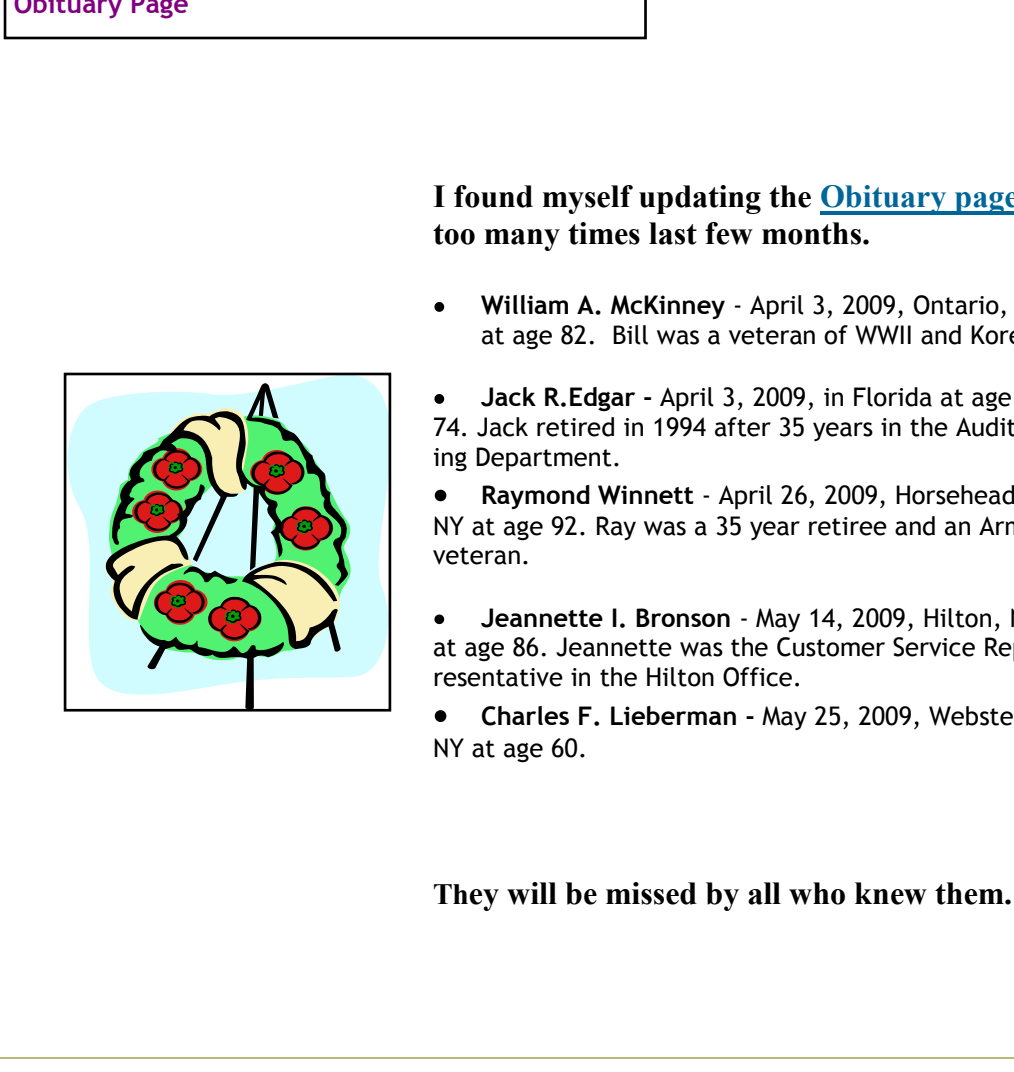
We would like the checks in our hands by **Thursday, July 16, 2009.** This will give us time to make sure there is enough food and drink for everyone attending.

Remember there will be no tickets sold at the door. The caterer only brings enough food to feed the attendance we guaranteed by the end of July.

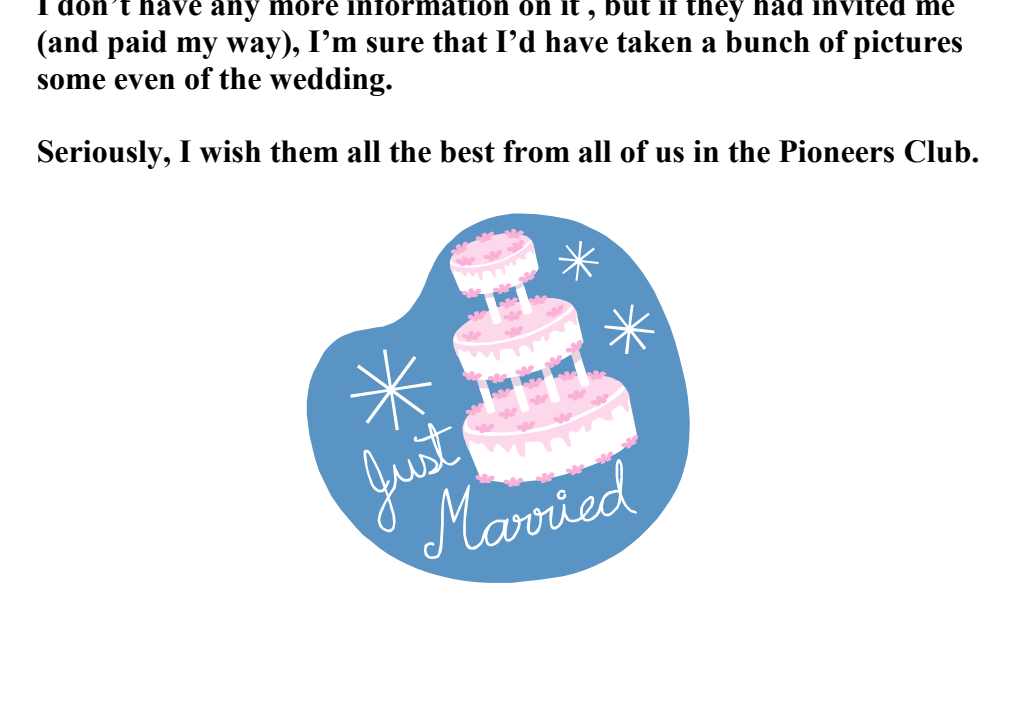
So let's get out there and spread the word. It's up to each and everyone of us to make sure our club continues.

If you're wondering what happened to your May issue, the answer is simple. I didn't write one.

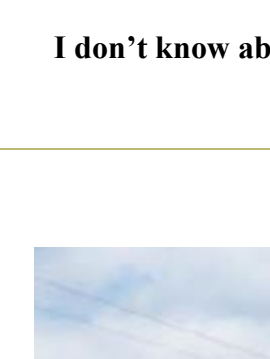
To make a long story short, I was visiting family in Florida and just forgot.

Next time I'll do better.

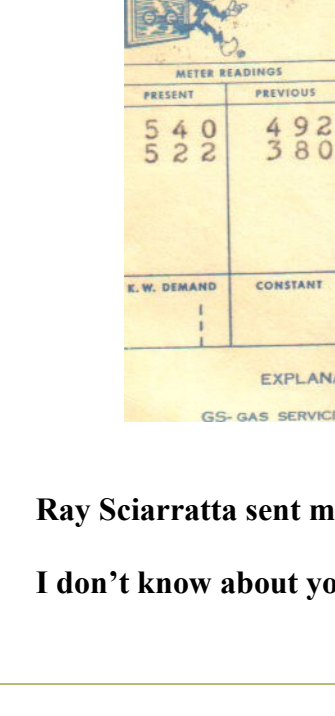
