

The case was filed Monday in U.S. District Court in Rochester by Sophia La-Mont, the administrator of the estate of **Frank P. LaMont Jr.**, her father. He

LaMont, a veteran of the Marine Corps with renal disease, became a VA hospice resident in August 2010, when he was 81. LaMont, a Rochester Electric and Gas Corp., retiree, is survived by two daughters.

"Although he was approaching the end of his life, he was comfortable, remained fairly mobile, and valued and appreciated the remaining months that he believed he had left," Deborah M. Field, a lawyer for the plaintiff, wrote in the suit. "The family is seeking justice for the tragic death of their father. They don't

In May 2011, Sophia LaMont filed a claim for \$500,000 with the Department of
