Arnie and I would like to thank you for helping to make this year's picnic another success.

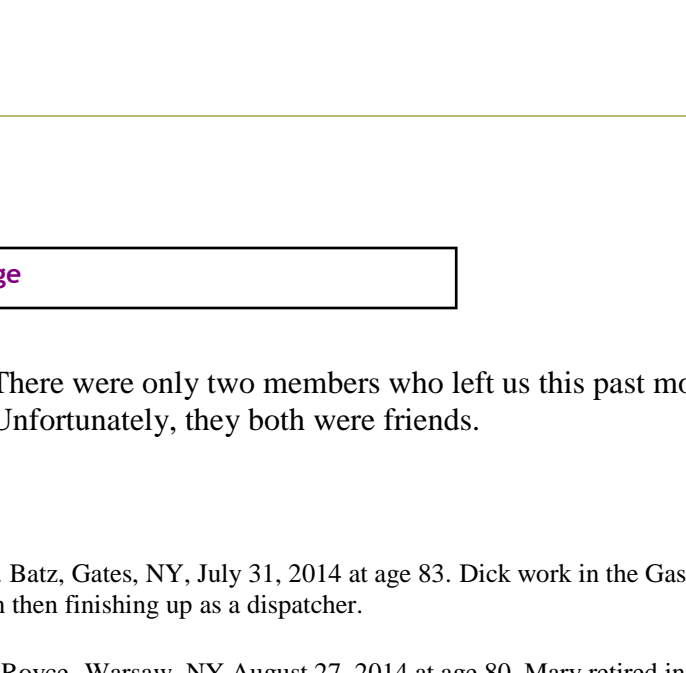
We had about 200 attendees this year and can guarantee everybody had a good time.

I'm sure that she would appreciate any comments or suggestion you have..

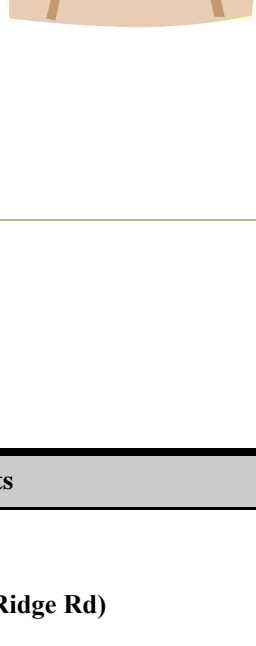
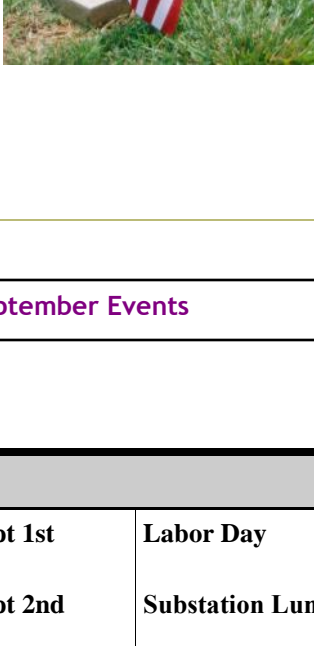


Obituary Page

There were only two members who left us this past month. Unfortunately, they both were friends.

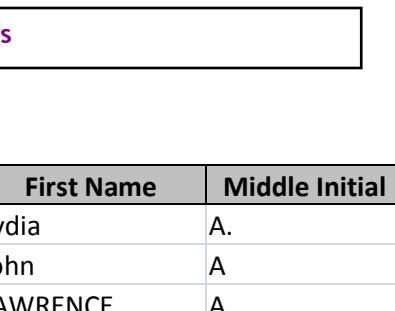

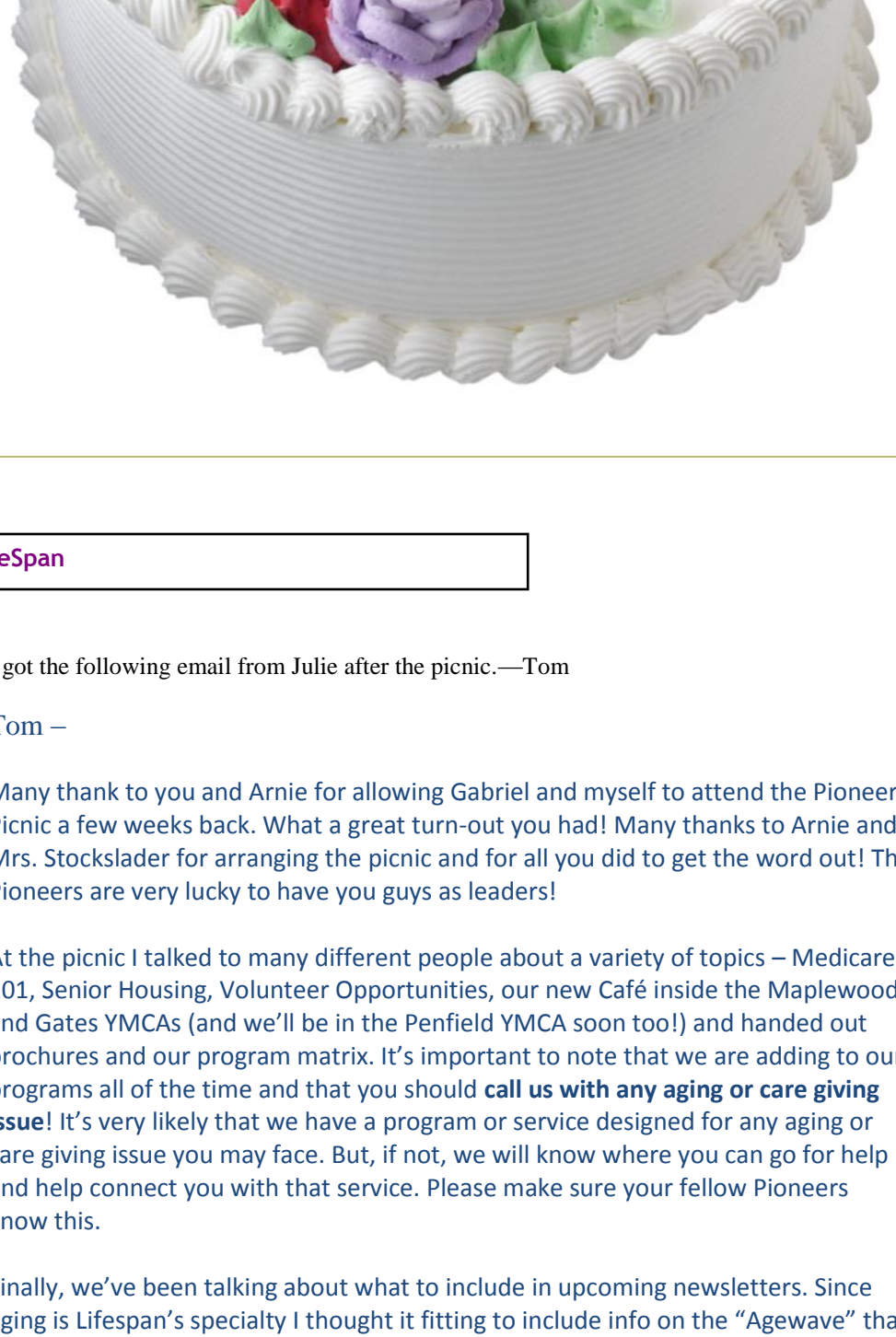

They are at it Again

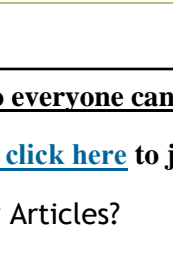
I have been getting emails like crazy lately. The topics are all the same, our pensions.
